

KULPMONT MINER ESCAPES DEATH AT GREEN RIDGE

**Albert Dellabride Injured
When Rock Weighing a
Ton Falls on Him.**

3 BUDDIES UNHARMED

Albert Dellabrida, 28, single, 929 Spruce street, Kulpmont, narrowly escaped death when a rock estimated at a ton rolled upon him at his place of employment at the Pennsylvania colliery at Green Ridge yesterday afternoon at 2:30.

Dellabrida with his three buddies, Sylvester Getrick, Mike Kulick, Ralph Bridy, all of Kulpmont, were working in No. 1 slope, east No. 5 vein at the time of the mishap.

All the miners but Dellabrida escaped from a large piece of top rock which fell near where the group was working. The unfortunate miner failed to escape from the scene in time to avoid the rock which rolled upon him and held him prisoner for a half hour.

The three buddies, with the aid of Paul Kulick, driver, Exchange, finally succeeded in extricating the injured man from beneath the rock.

At the Shamokin state hospital, where he was rushed following his arrival at the surface of the mine, it was reported that his condition is not serious. His injuries are confined to the body.
