

## **Trapped Mine Rescue Crew Digs Way Out**

MOWEAQUA, Ill., Dec. 29 (UP). —Twenty-three rescue workers dug themselves to safety today in the community cooperative coal mine after a new tragedy in the workings had impended when the group was cut off by a fresh fall of rock and shale.

The fall occurred shortly after the rescue squad discovered two more bodies in the north shaft of the mine where most of the 54 men trapped there last Saturday were working. Seven men are still unaccounted for but there was no hope they might be found alive.

The group of 23 workers were cut off from the main shaft for a short time last night when the roof of one of the tunnels collapsed. They succeeded in digging their way through safely.
