

## Rescued From Mine; Jumps Off Stretcher

Entombed for nearly eight hours in a coal hole sixty feet deep near Aristes, Stephen Popilchock, aged seventeen, of Slabtown, summoned enough strength to escape from ambulance attendants and make off to his home in a friend's automobile, following his rescue.

While being carried from the mine hole on a stretcher to the ambulance, Popilchock startled his rescuers by suddenly leaping from the stretcher and running to the automobile of a friend. He was driven home and apparently is none the worse for his experience.
