

Rescue Trevorton Man

Charles Hauser, 48, of Trevorton, sustained a compound fracture of the right leg, lacerations and other injuries of the head, face and body yesterday while robbing pillars in a coal hole near Trevorton.

Working on a pitch, he lost his balance when a rock fell out of the top and struck him on the head.

Hauser, plunging down the hole, caused a slide which buried him for fifteen minutes. He was unconscious when rescued by his son, Vernon, and two buddies, Peter and Francis Swartz.

He was taken to the Shamokin State Hospital for treatment.
