

FIVE BELIEVED DEAD IN MINE EXPLOSION

SEVENTH VICTIM DIES FOLLOWING TORNADO

Father, Mother and Four Children Injured When Freak Wind Passes

LOUISVILLE, Colo., Jan. 20.—Five men were trapped in the Monarch No. 2 mine of the National Fuel Company near here today by an explosion in an air shaft.

Two who escaped feared their companions had been killed.

Thomas Allen, state mine inspector, went to the mine from Denver with a rescue crew equipped with gas masks and took charge.

The explosion occurred as the seven men, workers on the night shift in the mine, were about to leave their jobs to be replaced by the day shift.
