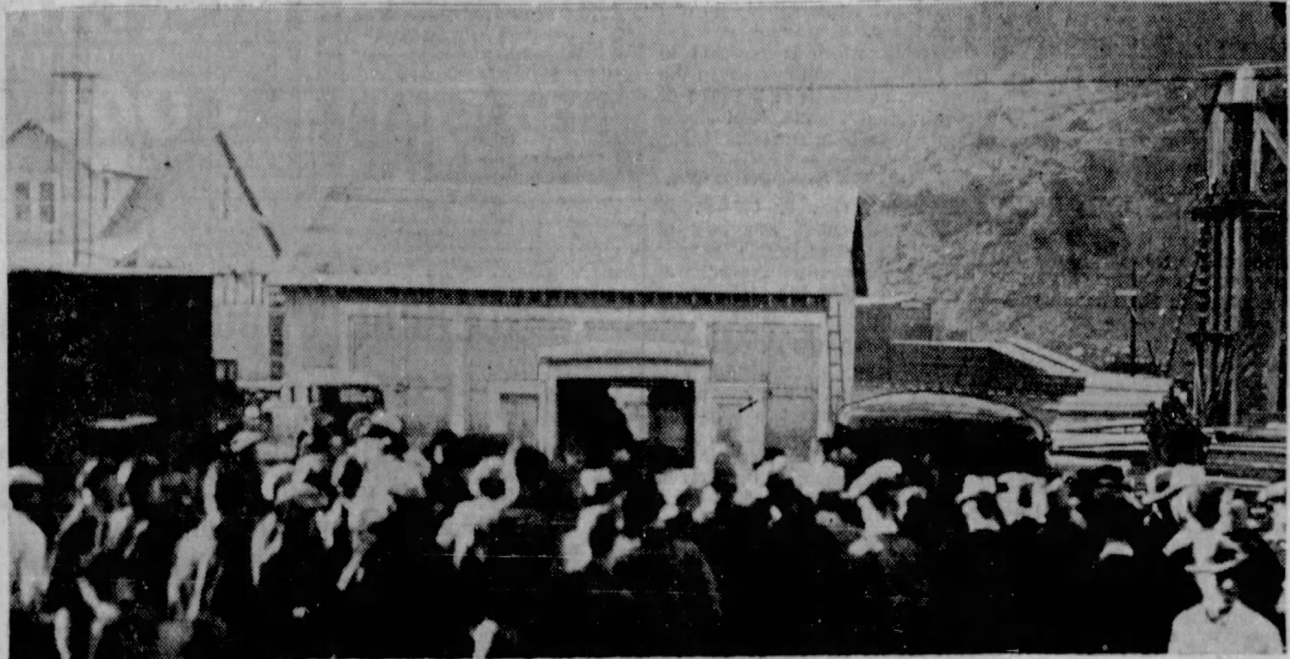


Crowd Watches Removal of Bodies After Morning Mine Disaster



Six hours after a cable snapped, dropping a Morning Mine elevator at Mullan, Idaho, 900 feet to the bottom of a shaft, the 10 bodies were extricated and brought to the surface. The photograph shows a group of fellow workmen, some of them relatives of the victims, crowded around the ore trains which brought the bodies outside the shaft house.
