

HURT IN RUSH OF COAL IN BOOTLEG COAL HOLE

One man was seriously injured and his two companions escaped injury shortly after 1 o'clock, Thursday afternoon, when a rush of coal caught them in a bootleg coal hole north of Williamstown.

Peter Rono, 41, was caught under the rush and had a vertebra in his back broken, several ribs fractured and a possible fracture of the left foot. He was rescued by his two companions Archie Shuttlesworth and Paul Garber, who dodged the fall, and was taken to the hospital in the J. B. Ralph ambulance after receiving first aid treatment from Dr. Wm. Connelly.

He was conscious when admitted to the hospital and his condition regarded as fair.
