

## Four Miners Saved From Cave In After Four-Hour Digging

POTTSVILLE, Pa., July 23.—

Four miners trapped 400 feet underground by a fall of coal in a shaft near Llewellyn walked to the surface tonight, grinning over their escape and scorning medical attention. A crew of 50 workers dug through a 40-ton cave-in to get the men out.

The rescue followed four hours of digging by works progress administration workers and miners in the shaft 3 1-2 miles from Pottsville, on property of the Delaware and Hudson Coal Company.

The four miners were Arthur Artz, 26; Al Acaley, 40; Albert Wise, 24, and Ralph Neidlinger, 45.

Only Wise went to a hospital for examination after coming to the surface. He was found to have suffered no ill effects and went home. The others insisted they were "all right."
