

Rescuers Free Entombed Men

TAMAQUA, Pa., Sept. 6.—(AP)—Two miners, entombed since last night in a mine air hole on the mountain side four miles south of Tamaqua, were rescued at noon today—uninjured.

William Lucas, 24, and Kenneth Lutz, 23, protesting that they were "all right," were rushed to a hospital for observation immediately after a rescue squad, which had been working since dawn, dug through the last of tons of rock to reach them.

Lutz and Lucas, accompanied by a third miner whose name was not learned, went out to the mountain yesterday from nearby Reevesdale. Lutz and Lucas entered an air hole on the mountain hoping to find a vein of coal. The third man, who remained on the surface, gave the alarm after a cave-in closed the entrance to the hole.
