

**WICONISCO MINER RESCUED
AFTER MINE CAVE IN AT
LYTLE COLLIERY, FRIDAY**

Two hard coal miners were saved Friday from death in the Lytle Colliery where they had been imprisoned for more than twenty-four hours.

Rescue crews, working in relays, rescued Harry Hunter, 44, of Wiconisco, and Albert Muraski, 34, of Primrose, after tunneling through many tons of rock and coal on the fourth level.

The were taken to a Pottsville hospital for observation. Physicians said their condition was not serious but that they would be detained until all danger of pneumonia was past.

C. S. Grumm, superintendent of the colliery, directed the rescue work.

Mr. Hunter was discharged from the hospital and returned to his home in Wiconisco Tuesday. He suffered chiefly from shock and exposure.
