

MINER BURIED TO SHOULDERS IN COAL HOLE

Anthony Makoski, 21, Sunbury, R. D. 2, escaped serious injury and possible death late Tuesday afternoon when he was trapped in a bootleg coal hole by a slide while mining on Cameron Mountain, near Trevorton.

Mokoski, working with Theron Cressinger, this city, and Ralph Holdren, Sunbury, R. D. 1, was in the hole when the side started to cave in. Fortunately he was not totally covered, the debris going to his shoulder line, and his two companions were able to extricate him.

He was brought to Mary M. Packer hospital, this city, and given treatment. An x-ray picture showed that he is suffering with a fracture of the right leg in addition to minor bruises and cuts. He was reported good today. The fact that the hole had not been worked long and was not deep prevented the accident from being more serious.
