

FOUR MEN TRAPPED IN CLINTONVILLE COAL MINE FOR FOUR HOURS

Car Breaks Loose in Mike Serge Mine, Knocking Down Timbers and Causing Cave-In.

CLINTONVILLE, April 5.—The coal mine of Mike Serge on the McKinley farm caved in Wednesday evening. One of the cars got loose, leaving the tibble, it ran into the mine and dislodged the timbers. Approximately 30 feet of the entrance to the mine was closed, leaving four men inside. Among

them were James Silvis and Floyd Ford. They were rescued within two hours from the time the mine was closed shut.
