

MINER IS RESCUED FROM SLATE FALL

Ameagle, W. Va., July 6 (AP).—Rescue workers, spurred on by the cries of a trapped comrade, brought him out from beneath a slate fall today and went back again for another miner they feared was dead.

George Nessos, 59, shouting through a wall of coal and slate, directed fellow workers to the spot where he was pinned to the earth. Nessos was taken to a hospital for treatment of severe injuries.

Farther back in the American Eagle Collieries company mine the workers expected to find the body of Clyde Compton, 30. They had heard nothing from him since the big pile of slate fell at 11 a. m.
