

INDEPENDENT MINER IS CAUGHT BY FALL

**Faust Bertie, 37, of Sheppton,
Rescued From Coal Hole—
Injuries Not Serious.**

Faust Bertie, 37, of Sheppton, was caught by a fall of coal and rock at 1:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon, in an independent coal hole about 4 miles west of Sheppton, and was rescued a half hour later.

He was given first aid treatment at the office of Dr. James Longo, in Sheppton, and was directed to enter the State Hospital here for observation. The exact nature of his injuries was not immediately determined, but were not regarded as serious.

It was not until approximately 20 minutes after the fall occurred that Bertie's plight was discovered by Adolph Ferrari, of Sheppton, who was walking by and heard the victim's moans.

Help was immediately summoned and the rescue was effected by Peol Longo, John Tamea, Homer Houser and Annible Bertie, all of Sheppton.
