

MEN TRAPPED BEHIND FALL IN MINE ARE RESCUED UNINJURED

**Workers In Wanamie Colliery Tap
Signals On Pipe That Gives Alarm
To Men On Surface.**

Wilkes-Barre, Sept. 16.—Five mine workers, caught behind a fall of roof yesterday in the Wanamie colliery, of the Glen Alden Coal Company, tapped an alarm by way of pipes and were rescued uninjured. The fall cut off the gangway of a slope and the five men were trapped back of the fall.

The alarm signals given on water pipes were heard on the surface and within a short time a rescuing force started the work of clearing away the fall. While the rescuers worked they kept up conversation with the trapped men, who were rescued after having been imprisoned about four hours.

The men were: Edward Makowski, assistant mine foreman, Wanamie; Stanley Symolzak, miner, Mocaqua; his son, Edward, laborer; Edward McCloskey, miner, Wanamie, and Edward Wozniak, laborer, Wanamie.
