

Saved From Coal Hole But Dies in Hospital

William Koons Second To Meet Death In Pine Hill Accident; Brave Throughout Ordeal

TIII be all right now," William Koons, 44, of 101 N. George street, this city, told bootleg miners as they rescued him Saturday afternoon at 4:25 from the bootleg coal hole on the Pine Hill Mountain in which ne and his brother-in-law Roy Kramer, 38, of 747 N. Centre street, this city, had been imprisoned Friday.

Kramer had been recovered dead shortly before noon.

But Koons' Injuries and the shock of being buried alive more than 24 hours in a coal hole were too great and he died Saturday night at 11:40 in the Pottsville Hospital.

Sorrow that had been replaced with joy again is evident in the Koons home here. Saturday morning his wife and three daughters, Dorothy, Bertha and Mae, heard that the husband and father of the family was dead.

And then Saturday at noon it was learned that he was alive. Eagerly the family awaited the news as miners worked desperately to free him.
