TEN MEN DEAD IN MINE BLAST AT BATES, ARK.

Working Crews Able to Rescue Uninjured Miners and Bring Out Bodies of All Victims in Short Time.

BATES, Ark., Aug. 28.—(INS)—State Mine Inspector J. W. Fitz-jarrell today launched an investigation into a mysterious blast which last night trapped and killed ten miners in the Bates Coal corporation mine at Bates.

The blast, which occurred 1,700 feet beneath the surface, was the second fatal explosion to occur at the mine in recent years. Five persons were killed in the same shaft four years ago.

The mine was not badly damaged by the blast, and work crews were able to rescue the uninjured miners and bring out the bodies of the victims within a short time.

The dead were listed by company officials this morning as:

The victims apparently were all killed instantly.

Bates is a small village of only 173 residents, most of whom work for the coal company. The blast occurred shortly before dark, and within a few minutes virtually all residents of the town gathered at the mine.
