

5 Miners Freed From Cavein Trap

Stoystown, Pa.—(U.P.)—Five miners trapped for eight hours in a small domestic coal mine a mile and a half north of here were freed uninjured last night by rescue crews who tunneled 30 feet through a rockfall to reach them.

The men, Orrin Dunmier and his son, Roy, and William McVicker and his two sons, Robert and Peter, were trapped by the rockfall in the Maust Mine, a small shaft operated by Dunmier and producing coal only for domestic purposes.
