

Park City Miners Safe After Cave-in

It was good news to Heber City miners and townspeople Wednesday night when word reached here that nine neighboring miners from Park City had been rescued unhurt from a cave-in in the Silver King's Alliance shaft. One Heber man, Archie Briggs and Homer Murray of Midway were among the trapped men.

It was a different ending than comes to the most mine cave-in stories. Everybody that was trapped was rescued alive, and all were unhurt. Apparently they suffered little discomfort, except the mental anguish of being trapped underground. Sandwiches and coffee were lowered to them during the day through a narrow cut by rescuers.

The men were 21 hours underground. They were rescued about 4 p. m. Wednesday. The cave-in occurred when a waste chute collapsed between the 800 and 900 foot levels.

Besides Mr. Briggs and Mr. Murray, other men in the cave-in were Archie Maynard, Pete Rosilla, Ralph Garbett, Harold Locke, Ralph Brown and Henry John, all of Park City, and Lynn Rockhill of Peoa.
