## RESCUE MINER BURIED 4 HOURS

After a terrifying experience of being buried alive for four hours, Charles Madden of Brady, Coal Township, was recuperating in the Shamokin State Hospital today.

Madden was at work in a coal hole north of Brady Saturday afternoon when there was a slide of rock and he vanished from sight.

State Mine Inspector P. J. Friel of Shamokin, was summoned by fellow workmen to direct digging through the debris and after four

hours of effort, Madden was found pinned down by a heavy rock. He suffered a crushed left leg but was otherwise little the worse for his experience, there having been sufficient air space in his living tomb to prevent suffocation during the four hours that he awaited rescue.
