

Brady Bootleg Miner Rescued

A crew of independent miners labored four hours before freeing Charles Madden, Webster street, Brady, who was trapped in a bootleg coal mine a short distance north of Brady.

The accident victim at first was thought to be seriously injured, but after being examined at Shamokin Hospital was allowed to return to his home. He sustained bruises of the legs.

Fellow workmen said Madden was trapped by a fall of rock and that he was covered to the waist. Working carefully under directions of P. J. Freil, mine inspector, a rescue crew succeeding in extricating Madden without causing further falls.
