Keysock sobbed hysterically when taken to the hospital and told attendants there how thankful he was to be alive. He said that he could hear his companion and could tak to him for a time, but later when the rescue work began, he could no longer hear him. Oplansky died of a broken neck and serious chest and body injuries.

Shortly after Keysock was rescued from the mine, several other falls occurred and it is believed these caused the oeath of his companion. Rescuers had little hope of rescuing Oplansky, all world War veteran and a well known member of the Minesville Amort man Leglon Post, is survived by his widow and four children.
