

Six Are Killed In Mine Blast

28 Are Rescued
After Dust Explosion

INDIANA, Pa., June 30—(INS)—
Of 34 miners trapped in the Rochester and Pittsburgh Coal Company's No. 2 mine near here as the result of an explosion underground, 28 were rescued alive late today. All of the bodies were recovered.

Of the 28 men brought out alive, 17 were burned badly enough to be taken to the hospital and several of these were reported in a critical condition.

The 34 men were working in Section Three of the mine, at nearby McIntyre, when the blast, described as a dust explosion, rocked the entire region. Last New Year's Eve, five miners were entombed in the same mine for 18 hours but escaped when workmen tunneled through to them.
