

4 Miners Buried By Slide Rescued

SCRANTON, Jan. 15 (A. P.).—
Four mine workers were rescued from entombment today after being imprisoned six hours behind hundreds of tons of rock at the No. 1 tunnel, Coal Brook colliery, Carbondale.

The men were loading coal on a shaker chute belt when a long section of the roof in the main gangway, the only passageway to the slope, collapsed. The gangway was blocked with debris.

A crew of rescue workers with picks and shovels carved an opening through the blocked gangway. Two hours later communications were established with the men by tap drills. The fall occurred at 11 A. M. and the men were freed at 5 P. M. The tunnel is operated by the Hudson Coal Co.
