

MINER RESCUED FROM ENTOMBMENT

A 24-year-old Olyphant mine worker was rescued yesterday from behind a 50-foot wall of rock 700 feet below the earth's surface. He was Peter Partonova, who was alive and recovering last night in Mid-Valley Hospital. He suffered from shock.

State Mine Inspector L. M. Evans said Partonova was working in a chamber a mile and a half from the base of the Edy Creek Colliery shaft when the rock roof collapsed. He was entombed from 6 p. m. Saturday to 9. a. m. yesterday.

Partonova shouted directions to a rescue squad of 25 men all through the night. He was without food, but had water and lights, which were dimming as he was released.
