

INJURED MINE WORKERS GAIN, IS ANNOUNCED

Three more of the victims of the Kenilworth mine explosion died late last week, one passing away late Thursday at the Price city hospital and two others expiring Friday, one of whom had been confined to the Kenilworth hospital.

Three of the men had died almost immediately following the explosion. David Bennett died Thursday night as the result of his burns and Arthur William Smith passed away at the local hospital Friday morning. Ivan Jensen was the miner who died in the Kenilworth hospital.

Gilner Nielsen, Clem Hawks and Ivan Russell Jackson were the miners who died on Wednesday night following the explosion that day. They had all been confined to the Price city hospital. Others who were injured in the explosion are Richard Sarrimond, Arthur Lermusiaux, Nick Markakis, George Archibque and Felipe Armizo. Mr. Sarrimond was the crew foreman.

A report this morning from the hospital indicated that the burned patients are improving as well as might be expected under the circumstances, promise of full recovery being real bright at the present time.

In a statement concerning the explosion S. C. Harvey, state mine inspector, said that it appeared that every precautionary action possible had been taken by the company in the safety line in the mine, that the "explosion was caused by a severe bounce and that the bounce was something that could not be foreseen."
