

2 BURIED MINERS RESCUED; LIVE

UNIONTOWN, Feb. 23 (AP)—Two coal miners were rescued last night after being buried for several hours under 30 tons of slate in Clyde No. 1 mine of the Republic Steel Corp., near Brownsville.

They were Lloyd Colvin, 33, and Thomas W. Jones, 38, who were recovering today in the Brownsville hospital. Colvin suffered a fractured right leg and Jones chest injuries and fractured ribs.

A dozen other miners narrowly escaped the fall. Jones, partly shielded by the boom of a loading machine, was able to talk to the rescue party which worked for two and one-half hours to reach him. The mishap occurred several miles from the surface opening.
