## Two Mineworkers Killed, 7 Burned

## Victims of Gas Blast At Buttonwood Mine

Two Glen Alden Coal Co. employes were killed and seven others were burned, four of them critically, in an explosion of gas at noon today in the Inman Shaft of the Buttonwood Colliery, Hanover Township.
