Four Miners Die In Fall Down Shaft DUEKTOWN -(UP)- Four miners were killed when they fell 1300 feet down a shaft in a newlyopened Tennessee Copper Company mine in a remote mountain section of Southeast Tennessee near here last night. Authorities identified the gead as: Thomas Hickey, Ducktown; U. L. Hawkins, Hawkinstown; Clarence Huffman, Hawkinstown; Joe Hughes, McCaysville, Ga. Sam E. Sharp, safety engineer at the mine, said today the miners reached the top of the shaft opening at the zinc mine where they ordinarily would have gone down in a bucket.
