

BOY SURVIVES 75-FOOT PLUNGE

**Rescue Crew Headed By
Policeman Saves Tot, 8,
Near Shamokin.**

An 8-year old boy was rescued from an abandoned coal hole at Shamokin Monday afternoon through the combined efforts of a police officer and volunteers.

Little Denny May, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert L. May, 1004 N. Shamokin street, Shamokin, fell 75 feet into the hole and had to spend an hour there before he was brought to the surface.

Denny, with some other children, was playing in the vicinity of his home when he fell into the mine, located on North Mountain, just north of Shamokin.

One of his companions raced 500 feet to inform Mrs. May of the accident. She called Shamokin police and Officer Francis Rogers responded and directed rescue operations.
