BOY IN WELL RESCUED

2-Year-Old in 18-Foot Shaft for 4 Hours in Colorado

AURORA, Colo., April 16 (A)

— Two-year-old David Mark
Counterman, his face scratched
and smeared with tears, was
raised to safety late today after
spending nearly four hours at
the bottom of an eighteen-foot
well shaft. The shaft was eighteen
inches in diameter.

"He screamed all the time he was in the hole," said George Moorehead, fire chief of this Denver suburb. "But the minute we laid hands on him he gave a feeble grin and stopped."

Workers drilled a parallel shaft, then angled under the child. Mr. Moorehead and two other men made their way to the bottom of the rescue shaft and dug through to the boy.

They pulled him head first into the new shaft and then to the surface as his mother and nearly 1,000 neighbors and other onlookers cheered.

David tumbled into the shaft when his father, Charles, 24, turned away to rest from working a hand-operated auger he was using to dig a water well in the rear yard of his home.
