## 13 Bodies Found in Mine, Hope Is Gone for 5 Others

Searcher Says Group Apparently Asphyxiated Within Few Hours After Being Trapped Inside West Virginia Pit Last Week

LOGAN, W. Va., March 16 4. Until they found the first body, searchers held some hope that the 18 men trapped in Holden Coal Mine 22 might still be alive.

By early today 13 bodies had been hauled out of the gasfilled passageways and the last wisp of hope for the others was gone, but the search went on.

Somewhere in the dank honeycomb of tunnels were the other members of the digging Plan Bolsters party imprisoned March 8 by a cave-in and fire nearly three miles from the mine opening.

Two in the original group of 20 scrambled to safety moments after discovery of the fire, apparently touched off when falling slate snapped an electric trolley wire.

around the clock against fire, smoke, knee-deep water, and a makeshift ventilating system.

The first body was found sprawled alone. Twelve others were in two nearby heaps.

Wrapped in blankets and plastic bags, the first bodies were carried to the base of the 485-foot elevator shaft and reached the surface at 4:47 a.m.

Snow had started an hour earlier and had blanketed the grimy mine buildings and ground. A crowd of about 50, none of them relatives, watched the bodies arrive at the surface more than 189 hours after the men reported to work last Tuesday morning. They were taken to Logan for identification.

A line of about six ministers read the 23rd Psalm in unison as the bodies arrived.

One rescue worker said it took a six-man team about 105 minutes to bring one body from the depths of the mine to the elevator. They had to bypass the smouldering fire area and crawl through tiny passageways.

One miner said a note was found in one man's hand. He said it told his wife he loved her more than she thought and asked her to raise her children in a Christian life.

Hundreds began flocking last night to this little valley mining community of neat hillside bungalows. They got as far as a state police barricade four miles up the road.
