

TRIED TO SAVE OTHERS

TWO MINE RESCUERS LOST
THEIR LIVES.

One Over Estimated the Amount of
Oxygen in His Helmet and the
Other Went Beyond the
Air Circuit.

Trinidad, Colo., Feb. 10.—Eleven are known to be dead and six are missing as a result of an explosion in a Cokedale mine, near here, last night. E. A. Sutton, assistant superintendent of the mine, and Robert Meek, a volunteer rescuer, lost their lives trying to reach the missing men.

Sutton over estimated the amount of oxygen in his helmet and fell a victim to black damp. Meek fell unconscious after venturing ahead of the air circuit and died a few minutes after carried out.
