
LOST MINER RESCUED.

Wandered About Underground Four Days Near Pittston, Pa.

Pittston, Pa., Nov. 1.—John Zuranki, a laborer, after spending four days in an abandoned mine, a short distance north of this city, was brought to the surface at noon to-day in a pitiable condition.

All this time he had wandered about without food. His light went out on the first day, and after that the hours were spent in climbing over falls and crawling through small openings in gangways until he became exhausted and lay down to die. He was discovered accidentally by a watchman who went into the mine.

Zuranki was not missed from his boarding house, as he had told his family he was going away.
