

**MINERS RESCUED**

**Miners in Fremont Mine,  
Colorado, Hoisted to the  
Surface—Two Un-  
accounted For.**

Denver, Col., Nov. 23.—Fire started in the Fremont mine of the Colorado Fuel company Tuesday. There are 200 men in the mine but it is believed all will escape safely. The fire started in the mule stable underground.

The Fremont mine is south of Canon City, Col., and it is worked through two shafts, a haulage shaft and an air shaft. It is believed all the men in the mine are on the air shaft of the fire and may make their way safely to the surface. The mule stable, where the fire broke out, is about 1,500 feet from the bottom of the haulage shaft.

Canon City, Col., Nov. 23.—The miners caught in the workings of the Fremont mine of the Colorado Fuel & Iron company, which took fire in an underground mule stable late Tuesday afternoon, were hoisted to the surface one by one, through an air shaft which offers the only way of escape. More than one hundred and sixty have reached the surface and the mine officials declare that all but two of the men employed underground have been communicated with and are known to be safe. It is hoped that these two also are safe.
