## NARROW ESCAPE FROM DEATH

Searchers in the Anaconda Mine Cave-In Are Obliged to Cease Work.

A Mass of Rock Falls Suddenly-Stench from Decaying Bodies Unbearable.

Amendments to the River and Harbor Appropriation Bill Are Agreed To.

## WORK STOPPED.

A Mass of Rock Falls, Narrowly Missing a Party of Anaconda-Mine Searchers.

BUTTE, May 19.—[Special to the TRIBUNE. |- Searching for bodies in the Anaconda mine cave in has been vigorously prosecuted over since the accident until this morning, when a mass of rock fell near the place where a number of men were working, the men barely escaping with their lives. This so frightened the miners that they were loth to return to work. The ground is settling everywhere in the vicinity of the cave in. Besides this the temperature of the mine is excessively warm and the stench from the decaying bodies prevents the men from working but a few minutes at a time. It was deemed advisable to discontinue work on the 800 level until the caving and settling of the ground ceased. Accordingly Supt. Kane this evening stopped all work in the mine and told the men nothing would be done until Monday or Tuesday next. There are three more bodies buried in the mine.
