SAVED FROM DEATH IN MINE.

Two Men, Entombed, Barely Able to Embrace Rescuers.

Ashland, March 30.—After being entombed in a breast at the Bast colliery for more than eight hours and supposedly doomed to slow death by starvation, Peter Orbitsky and Stephen Muskah were rescued alive by fellow miners.

Both men were in a state of utter collapse, but uninjured, with just enough strength to fall upon the necks of their deliverers in a hysteria of joy when reached. They were found early yesterday morning behind a sudden rush of coal that made the rescue work perilous.
