BULLETIN. Washington.—Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson disclosed Thursday that the War and Justice departments are consulting to determine what the federal government should do, if anything, in connection with Georgia's government trouble.

Atlanta, Ga.—Herman Tamagade, elected governor of Georgia by the state legislature, asked the main executive office Thursday and barred the door to Gov. Ellis Arnall, who denounced him as "a claiming the office" by the "Talmadge" faction.

More than an hour before Arnall arrived at the Capitol building, he appeared. Tamagade refused to see him and insisted that he "would have to wait his turn to see the governor."

In a fighting statement soon after, Arnall said: "I came to the capital alone to continue on Page 2, Column 2."
