JOHNNY ADAMS, WHITE AMERICAN TIMBERMAN, AGE 30, WITH 12 YEARS' MINING EXPERIENCE, WAS SO SEVERELY INJURED BY A FALLING POST, THAT HE DIED 37 DAYS LATER. HE LEAVES TWO DEPENDENTS.

Adams was removing timbers from along the main barrier pillar to be set as safety timbers to start a new lift on a room pillar. He had removed four post and struck the fifth post to knock it from under the roof when a piece of slate measuring 2' X 5' X 8" fell. The slate rode the timber towards Adams striking him in the abdomen and injuring him internally.

RECOMMENDATIONS: THAT WHEN RECOVERING TIMBERS A POST PULLER BE USED. THAT NO TIMBERS BE REMOVED UNTIL A CAREFUL EXAMINATION HAS BEEN MADE. THAT ALL SAFETY PRECAUTIONS BE TAKEN TO PREVENT ACCIDENT FROM FALLING SLATE OR ROOF.
