Harry Shoup, Formerly of Canonsburg, Crushed This Morning at Republic Steel

Harry Shoup, 39, of Rural Ridge, former Canonsburg resident, was fatally injured this morning when he was caught between two railroad cars while at work at Republic Steel Mine, Russeltown. The accident occurred at 3 a. m. and he died shortly afterwards while enroute to the Allegheny Valley Hospital, Tarentum. pital, Tarentum.
