

Sayre man dies of injuries from mine rock fall

A 59-year-old Republic Steel electrician, injured when a rock fell on him in a mine Monday, died yesterday in Carraway Methodist Hospital.

B. Frank Hobbs was trapped for several minutes when the rock crashed down on him while he was working in Republic's Sayre mine.

Hobbs lived in Sayre.
Funneral services will be at 2 p.m. tomorrow at Good Hope Baptist Church, with the Rev. Thedford Lively, the Rev. George Doss and the Rev. Grady Mitchell conducting. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Surviving are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. Kathryn Popadak of Compton, Calif., and Mrs. Jean Eadie of Sayre; a son, B. Frank Hobbs Jr.; a brother, Truman Hobbs of Dora; five sisters, Mrs. D. C.
