

WOMAN KILLED IN MINE

BREACH AT MAHANNOY CITY

Mrs. Sophia White, together with her husband and son, were picking coal yesterday afternoon in a mine beneath at the lower end of Maple street, Mahanoy City. They were at work under a ledge of slate and rock. Without warning this rock and slate became loosened and struck the unfortunate woman and completely buried her. The husband and son narrowly escaped.

Assistance being summoned, the work of rescue began and it was nearly an hour before the remains were recovered. The body was badly bruised and cut, and death must have been instantaneous. The victim of the accident was about 35 years of age and is survived by her husband and six children.
