

TWO WOMEN KILLED IN COAL MINE TRAP

THAYER, ILL., May 9.—Trapped under a fall of hundreds of tons of coal slack and slate, two Thayer women met instant death here today.

The women, Mrs. George Dolack, 55, and Mrs. Mary Bebnarchik, 60, were picking up pieces of coal from the dump at a mine when one side of the pile of slack caved in, burying them. The bodies were recovered from near the surface of the debris.

Mrs. Dolack is survived by her husband, two daughters, Miss Emma Dolack and Mrs. John Dusick, Chicago; three sons, Joseph, George and John Dolack, also of Chicago, and two brothers, Joseph Novak, Thayer, and John Novak, Joseph, Pa. Mrs. Bebnarchik is survived by two daughters, one of whom is Mrs. Joseph Edgerly, Denver, Colo., and three sons.
