

FOUR MINERS MAY RECOVER

Inquest Begun Into Fatal Accident At Shrewsbury.

Charleston, W. Va., March 8.—Physicians who are attending the victims of the Shrewsbury disaster, in which four miners were killed and four others injured by the breaking loose of a car, say that all the injured have a good chance of recovery.

Chief Mine Inspector J. W. Paul went to Shrewsbury this morning to make an inquiry into the accident. A jury was empaneled today by Coroner Beardsley to hold an inquest. The four victims, Andrew Hunt, William McSurley, John McSurley and Edward McGlotheln, who were killed instantly, will be buried tomorrow.
