

MINERS TRAPPED BY EXPLOSION IN MOFFAT CO. MINE

Five Men Believed to Have Perished; Bodies of Three Recovered; Rescuers at Work.

Oak Creek, Colo., Feb. 16.—The bodies of three of the five men who, on Saturday afternoon, were trapped in the No. 2 mine of the Moffat Coal Company, were recovered Sunday. C. Testas and Henry Wagner, shot firers in the mine, were believed to be dead, although rescuers were working in an effort to penetrate the wall of earth and coal which cut off their escape.

The three miners whose bodies were recovered were Ed Hamidy, Weaver Sharp and Patrick St. Patrick.

Joe Marvin, superintendent of the Haybro mine, was overcome by mine damp at No. 2 tunnel Monday. He was moved to a hospital in a serious condition.
