

LOST MINER FOUND

WILKES-BARRE, Pa., March 21.—James Kowolski, the lost miner, was found early today in the Stanton mine, in this city, after having wandered in the underground workings since last Saturday afternoon. He is in a hospital recovering from his experience. A bloodhound lowered into the mine on Monday to assist in the search failed to pick up a trail and Kowolski was found by a party headed by J. B. Pamblyn, superintendent of the mine. The miner was in a semi-conscious condition and half naked. He showed no marks of violence.

It is believed Kowolski became lost when he started to leave the mine last Saturday after telling his helper that he was not feeling well. When the helper came to the top of the shaft later he found that Kowolski had not checked out and the search was started. The spot where he was found is 2,000 feet from his working place.
