Rescue Team Recovers Two Bodies Near Drift

CHARLESTON, W. Va. (AP) — Rescue workers this morning found the bodies of two miners trapped by a gas explosion in the Chesapeake Coal Co. Compas No. 2 mine. Hope faded for the lives of 20 others.

Announcement of the finding of the first victims of the Thursday explosion was made by mine Supt. Harry Chapman, who said the bodies were recovered near a drift.

Seven other men were assigned to a drift 2,000 feet further into the mine and two men were assigned to the surface.

There was nothing on the surface to indicate what had happened. The mine was still operating.
