
ONE MINER IS RESCUED.

Hope That Others of the Montana Mine Victims May Be Alive.

Helena, Mont., April 11.—A party of rescuers succeeded this morning in descending to the 100-foot level of the Hope mine at Basin. The body of Albert Boulware, who went down yesterday and was overcome with gas and was unable to climb the ladder to the top and was left for dead, was found and hoisted to the surface. He was still alive, in spite of the fact that he had been in the mine over fourteen hours. Many now have hopes for the entombed seven men. Gas is rapidly leaving the mine and by tomorrow it will be possible to reach the bottom of the shaft, 300 feet. The party descended this afternoon midway between the 200 and 300-foot levels, but failed to find a trace of the miners.
