

NARROW ESCAPE IN OHIO.

Forty Miners Rescued From Burning Mine by Heroic Efforts.

Andover, O., Feb. 16.—Forty miners were imprisoned for four hours last evening in a burning mine at Linden Tree near here. The fire was started by the explosion of a barrel of gasoline which set fire to the timbers in the mouth of the mine. Egress was cut off and the mine filled with smoke.

For four hours the forty men carried water in their tin buckets and threw it on the flames. In the meantime a rescuing party had been organized in the village and fought the flames from the outside.

All were finally rescued without being injured.
