

EAST LIVERPOOL MAN RESCUED FROM A MINE

East Liverpool, O., May 29.—At an early hour this morning Patrick Connelly was rescued from a burning mine at Salineville where he had been confined since the night before. The fire was in the big vein shaft. Connelly had been in the mine attending to the pumps near the bottom of the shaft, and all chance of escape by the main entrance was cut off. Several times a body of volunteers, who had forced their way through the flames and smoke, were driven back. Finally entrance was gained through an air shaft, the rescuers descending by a ladder and reaching the pumps with extreme difficulty. Connelly was alive, but had fought the flames until almost exhausted. After he was taken to a place of safety a new attack was made on the flames.
